NOTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL FOR OCTOBER

- The Annual Election Meeting will be at 4pm Nov. 22.
- Pastor's Three-year Review is due soon. Pr David Kent will chair this. Pastor will attend Safe Church Coordinator training 14/10 and Pastors' retreat 19-21/10.
- Office Administrator: 3 applicants will be interviewed. Janice Cecil is currently filling in 4 hours/week.
- Congregational Archives: ways of improving these are being investigated.
- Pictorial directory. Paused due to COVID, steps towards this are being reinvigorated.
- Support for the Sprau family in PNG: a retiring offering is planned.
- Big Offering Sunday will be held Nov. 22.
- Updating St Marks' constitutional bylaws: volunteers for a review committee are being sought.
- Red Cross hiring our facility dates for 2021: Jan 5–8; Mar 29–Apr 1; Jun 29–Jul 2; Sept 28–Oct 1; Dec 29–31.
- Vicar: St Marks' has accepted an offer to take on a vicar again later this year.
- Finance: offerings are down \$18,000 for the year but facilities hire is up and government COVID payments means the budget is in surplus.
- Courtyard shade: donations are in hand for stage one to proceed asap. The appeal for the second stage will remain open until the first stage is completed.
- Manse: quotes are being sought for laundry and kitchen repairs. Leaking underground pipes have been cleaned and will be monitored.
- School: a Pastoral Support Worker (to replace Janene Overton who is retiring) is being sought and 2 School Council nominations – a Lutheran plus another practicing Christian who may be non-Lutheran. Council Chair Bev Gogel will be retiring from the council.
- Hill View Lutheran Services for the Disabled: David Schild is now Board Chairman and Public Officer, Paul Andrejic is Treasurer, James Ziersch a Board member, and Angela Strauss plans to join the board.

Return to Worship Guidelines

Return to Worship Guidelines

Thank you for making our 'return to worship' a smooth process. Please continue to observe the following:

- Maintaining 1.5m distance from others and make use of hand sanitiser
- Follow the direction of the greeters and ushers, as well as the signs and arrows
- Sign the declaration that you are present, well and understand the expectations of entry
- Fill the church from the front, only using seats without a reserved sign
- Members of the same household may sit together but others must remain 1.5m apart
