Broken

In the home I grew up in, it was not good if a piece of crockery was broken. Perhaps you broke your arm or leg. Right now you might be recovering from a part of your body that was 'broken.' Maybe it's my age showing but we're living in times where brokenness is rife! Even as God's people, we're broken, despite the new nature we have as the precious gift from a loving God. The relationship God wants to have with us is broken because so many people turn away from the very One who dearly loves us and wants everyone to have a loving relationship.

No wonder there are broken hearts, and broken lives. The list goes on as we see broken families, broken communities, broken nations that add up to a broken world. The pain of seeing and experiencing the personal loss and destruction of so many people in so many places, is almost unbearable as we see vision of wars, natural disasters and people's inhumanity to their own. It's a difficult reality to face that even you and I are broken, to a greater or lesser extent. We are the Church, the Body of Christ so we expect things might be better. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour." Let us delight greatly in the Lord, rejoice in the Lord, find our source of true joy and unity in Jesus. Let's celebrate our oneness in embracing each other as proclaimers of the good news of God's Kingdom; God's grace and love in Jesus for each one of us! This is our calling as dearly loved children of God. There's a broken community out there, and within our denomination of the Church. Each and every one whom God has created is meant for relationship. Can you be the healing hands, heart and love of Jesus to the broken someone in your sphere of influence, no matter how small your contribution might seem?

Before Jesus left this earth, he had a heart to heart prayer with his Father. This prayer for Jesus' followers is found in the Gospel of John, chapter 17. I invite you to join me in reading and meditating on Jesus' prayer and the unity we have in him, as he, the Father and the Holy Spirit are one.










Here and There



THE WAY FORWARD.

The Synod of the LCA in Melbourne in March spent much time debating proposals on the Ordination of Men and Women. A strong majority of voters directed the church to explore and present to 2024 Synod in Adelaide how one church with two ordination practices might function. Eight working groups have been formed to prepare a proposal for 2024 Synod. Over 100 people took up the opportunity to submit ideas to the working groups. The proposal or proposals that flow from this will be forwarded to pastors before the next Pastor's Conference, and also to all delegates well before next General Synod. The church has asked all members and congregations to pray for God to guide the church as it moves forward in its ministry and mission. Jesus says: the harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into the harvest field.

56th LWSA-NT Convention held at St Paul's Lutheran Church, Glenelg.4th May 2023

Theme: Storms of Life

Three ladies from St Mark's attended (Jan Hodgson, Val Schild and Jenny Girdham). Worship times were led by Glenelg's Pastor Tim Ebbs, which were welcoming, inspiring and thought-provoking. We were then welcomed by the Glenelg's congregation chairperson Sharon, Pastor David Altus (who will be retiring) and Pastor Stephen Schultz. The Bible verse Pastor Ebbs chose was 2 Thess 3:3 – The Lord is faithful, and he will strengthen and protect you. We experience many storms in our lives – loss of a loved one, sickness, redundancy, attacks from the Devil, all the heartache we hear on the TV news. With the visual display of Jesus in the boat on the lake with his disciples, he rebuked the waves – He said Peace, be still. Jesus is the true God of the universe. The Lord was faithful to his disciples. He is with us through all the storms of our lives. Jesus beckons us to rest with Him. God will protect us from the fury of the storms. We are in the boat with Him. Trust Him.

Guest Speaker was John van Ruth, CEO of Lutheran Disability Services. (LDS has been running for over 30 years. There are 84 clients in over 25 houses). They do get some government funding. John gave an interesting testimony of his life, being originally born in Holland and one of eleven children. Though not a Lutheran, but Anglican, he is very passionate about his role and working with disability. LDS aims to give these lovely souls, a sense of empowerment and connection – they create great opportunities for them to serve others. John's message to us was "God loves the messiness of life". Encouraging us to practise expressing God's love and grace by getting messy!

LWA. Maureen Turner and Val Schild spoke on behalf of President Grace Kroehn. (Grace was absent as she was on her way to Geraldton for the WA Convention).

ALC. Pastoral Students Fund & the Adelaide Deaf Church need assistance & support, plus the NT camps. Treasurer's Report. Ruth Kaesler gave her final treasurers report, as she is retiring after serving 6 years. The new treasurer will be Faye Jenke. Ruth reported, that to date we have 1,030 paid members for 2023 (85 less members), last year 2022 there were 1,115 members.

Joan Schiller is retiring as Secretary after serving for many years. Joan will still serve as the 'Tidings' editor.

Lutheran care: - the Op shop is next to the Glenelg Church & was established 20 years ago .We had the opportunity to visit the Op shop during our 1½ hour lunch break.

Immanuel College Yr 9 band played after lunch and Devotion was led by Pastor Ebbs, continuing with the theme. Pastor Ebbs introduced us to two women from the Glenelg congregation who courageously both gave personal testimony of their lives: one dealing with sexual abuse as a child by a family member and later domestic violence during her marriage. They both showed extreme courage .

Lutheran Women Magazine report by Grace Bock. Reported cost of production has increased and they are finding it hard to break even and are losing money. The magazine is 50 years old!
